Sharon Buccino, in her work for NRDC's Land & Wildlife program, has spearheaded litigation that challenged oil and gas drilling in Wyoming, Colorado, and Utah, and led the fight to stop new coal mining outside of Utah's Bryce Canyon National Park. Her more recent work focuses on energy policy and government transparency.

He also served over 10 years as a federal prosecutor in the Justice Department's Environmental Crimes Section, a Special Assistant United States Attorney, and a Special Assistant to the Assistant Administrator for Enforcement at USEPA. Mr. Garbow also has served as an instructor at the DOJ's National Advocacy Center. He is a member of the Virginia and District of Columbia bars.



Michael Wara is an expert on energy and environmental law. His research focuses on climate policy. Professor Wara was formerly a geochemist and climate scientist and has published work on the history of the El Niño/La Niña system and its response to changing climates. Professor Wara is a research fellow at the Program in Energy and Sustainable Development at Stanford and a center fellow at the Woods Institute for the Environment.
